IN THE MATTER OF THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS, 1913 and 1931.

[REDACTED] the owners of the Monument known as Craiglockhart Castle (in ruins) situated on the north-west side of a carriage way leading north-east from the building formerly known as Edinburgh Hydropathic and now as the Convent of the Sacred Heart and joining the road running eastward from the junction of Craiglockhart Avenue with Colinton Road now called Glenlockhart Road, said Castle being 130 yards north-east by north of the north-east corner of said building, 20 yards south-west of the junction of said carriage way with said first mentioned road and 140 yards south-east by east of the junction of said road with Colinton Road being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as Craiglockhart Estate situated in the Parish of Colinton and County of Edinburgh.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.
