
## THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 3250 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Slains Castle comprises the remains of a tower-house, of later medieval date, surviving as the south-eastern corner of the structure, with a series of earthworks defending a steep-sided, rocky coastal promontory that projects into the North Sea. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, to include the promontory and the surrounding cliffs, in which evidence for the castle's construction and use as well as any earlier remains may survive. To allow for their maintenance, the footprints of 13 and 19 Old Castle, Old Slains Castle and Dixon's Cottage, the gardens and property boundaries of Old Slains Castle and 13 and 19 Old Castle, all septic tanks, all above-ground elements of utility poles, the upper 0.3m of the existing track and hard standings, and all post-and-wire fences are specifically excluded from the scheduled area. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Slains and the County of Aberdeen as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto




