The monument known as Castle Calvay, castle, Calvay, Loch Boisdale comprises the remains of a small castle, possibly originally a dun, situated on an islet off Calvay, on the S side of Loch Boisdale. The area to be scheduled consists of the whole of the small islet, above the edge of the tidal rocks: this coincides with the enclosure and its interior. 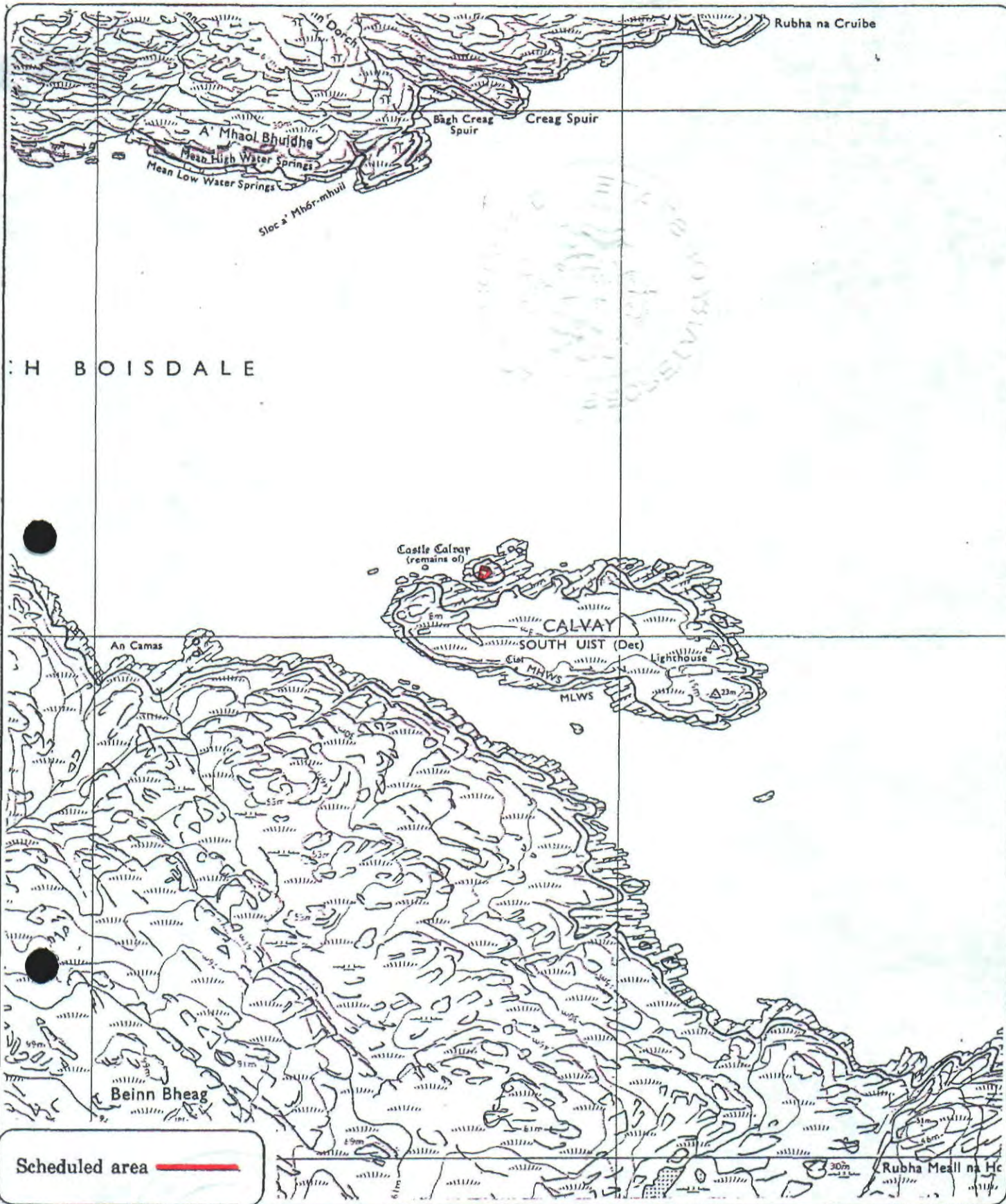

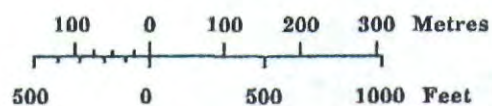
