THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Pittarthie Castle, comprises a defensible house of staggered L-shaped plan and of largely domestic appearance, the initial construction of which dates from around the time of a royal grant of the lands to Andrew Logan of Easter Granton in 1598. The house, which is built of coursed rubble, rises through three principal storeys. The area to be scheduled is an irregular rectangle, with maximum dimensions of 42m from east to west and 42m from north to south. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dunino and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.



Scheduled Area


