

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Craigmillar Castle, castle and gardens comprises the castle and its surrounding designed landscape. The area to be scheduled includes the castle and those elements of the designed landscape that can still be seen or inferred. The area measures a maximum of 910m SW to NE by 490m NW to SE. Modern fences and roads are specifically excluded from the scheduling, but all masonry walls, including those at the boundaries of the scheduled area, are included. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Liberton and the County of Midlothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.




