

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Elgin Cathedral comprises the surviving portions of Elgin Cathedral, its ancillary buildings, graveyard, boundary wall and gates. The area to be scheduled includes the remains of the cathedral and chapter-house, the cathedral lodge, and the graveyard surrounding the cathedral up to and including the boundary wall and gates: an area measuring some 130m E-W by 90m N-S. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Elgin and the County of Moray as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the

Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section I(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
