THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Stirling, Mar's Wark, uncompleted residence comprises the late 16th century Renaissance façade of an unfinished building constructed for the Earl of Mar. The area to be scheduled is irregular in shape with maximum dimensions of 32m N-S by 15m E-W to include the upstanding remains and an area of ground extending 2m out from the outer walls. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Stirling and the County of Stirling as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
