THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Castle of Cowie consists of the remains of a medieval castle. The only remains of the castle visible today consist of a length of masonry, which formed the plinth of a wall cutting across the promontory. The area to be scheduled is irregular, being defined to the NW by the field boundary and on the other sides by the foot of the slope of the promontory. It measures approximately 50m N-S by 70m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Fetteresso and the County of Kincardine as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
